



Levenmouth Campus & Windmill Community Campus



The new **Levenmouth Campus** of Fife College recently opened in Buckhaven, which has proven to be an excellent investment in the Levenmouth area.

I enjoyed meeting staff and pupils with my colleague Jenny Gilruth MSP to see the campus in action. The campus was supported with £25million of Scottish Government funding, and is situated with the new Levenmouth Academy for high school students. We'll both be returning to visit Levenmouth Academy soon.





I was also pleased to attend the opening of the new **Windmill Community Campus** in Kirkcaldy. This fantastic new facility offers a new home for both Rosslyn School and Viewforth High School, along with community facilities including a library and community use centre.

The Scottish Government is spending £1.8billion in the Schools for the Future programme, which will see a total of 112 schools rebuilt or refurbished by 2020, and it is great to see the positive impact of this locally.

I was proud to sign up to the **Befriending Network Pledge** at Kinghorn Library with **Lead Scotland** to help tackle the issue of loneliness in the constituency. The pledge was made at the start of Befriending Week.
